Driving Directions

From Seattle-Tacoma (SeaTac) Airport:

Take Route 518 to I-5 North.

Take I-5 North (15 miles, 20 - 30 min.) to Mercer Exit, (turn right with traffic in middle lane.)

Turn left on Valley St. (Stay with traffic flow, go to the left of Burger King, immediately get into the right lane.)

Turn right at the next light (Westlake Ave. N., immediately get into left lane.)

Turn left at first left (Aloha St., do not take "U-turn", go about 30 feet just before

① Courtyard Marriott and turn left on Aloha).

Go up hill to Dexter Ave, turn right on Dexter Ave.

Park underground at 1100 Dexter Ave.

Have a maritime adventure sans seasickness, scurvy or navigational snafus. This 98-foot tugboat moored in Lake Union is home to eight rooms that range from small to extra, extra small. The largest rooms, such as the Admiral's and Captain's Cabins have private bathrooms, refrigerators and in-your-face lake and downtown views. Guests in smaller rooms have to share bathrooms, but all spaces have their own TVs and VCRs—hardly a deprived seafaring setup. Owners serve a full gourmet breakfast in the galley every morning, and wallpaper made from nautical charts, old brass ship's clocks and portholes with views of Lake Union round out the ambiance.
